**ORDINANCE NO. 9**  
**AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING**  
**FOR THE ISSUANCE OF**  
**SEWAGE DISPOSAL PLANT**  
**BONDS OF THE CITY OF**  
**ANDOVER, KANSAS, IN THE**  
**SUM OF \$24,000.00 FOR THE**  
**PURPOSE OF PAYING THE**  
**COST OF CONSTRUCTING A**  
**SEWAGE DISPOSAL PLANT**  
**AND OUTFALL SEWER FOR**  
**SAID CITY.**

WHEREAS, The governing body  
of the City of Andover, Kansas,  
has heretofore declared it neces-  
sary to construct a sewage dis-  
posal plant and outfall sewer for  
said city; and

WHEREAS, In order to provide  
funds to pay the cost thereof it is  
necessary to issue Sewage Dis-  
posal Plant Bonds of the city in  
the amount of \$24,000.00, of which  
\$18,924.22 shall be used to pay the  
cost of construction of the Sewage  
Disposal Plant and \$5,077.25 shall  
be used to pay the cost of con-  
struction of the outfall sewer,  
which is the estimated cost of said  
projects:

THE THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED  
BY THE GOVERNING BODY  
OF THE CITY OF ANDOVER,  
KANSAS:

SECTION 1. That for the pur-  
pose of providing funds to pay the  
cost of constructing the city's sew-  
age disposal plant and outfall sewer  
heretofore authorized to be con-  
structed, the Mayor and City  
Clerk are hereby authorized, em-  
powered and directed to execute  
and issue Sewage Disposal Plant  
Bonds of the City of Andover,  
Kansas, in the principal amount of  
\$24,000.00, which bonds shall be  
dated June 1, 1958, shall be in  
denomination of \$1,000.00 each,  
shall be designated Series A, 1958,  
shall be numbered from 1 to 24,  
inclusive, and shall bear interest  
and become due and payable as  
set forth in the following schedule,  
to-wit:

Bond No. 1, Amount \$1,000.00,  
Interest per Annum 3 1/2 %, Matur-  
ity Date December 1, 1959.

Bond No. 2, Amount \$1,000.00,  
Interest per Annum 3 1/2 %, Matur-  
ity Date December 1, 1960.

Bond No. 3, Amount \$1,000.00,  
Interest per Annum 3 1/2 %, Matur-  
ity Date December 1, 1961.

Bond No. 4, Amount \$1,000.00,  
Interest per Annum 3 1/2 %, Matur-  
ity Date December 1, 1962.

Bond No. 5, Amount \$1,000.00,  
Interest per Annum 3 1/2 %, Matur-  
ity Date December 1, 1963.

Bond No. 6, Amount \$1,000.00,  
Interest per Annum 3 1/2 %, Matur-  
ity Date December 1, 1964.

Bond No. 7, Amount \$1,000.00,  
Interest per Annum 3 1/2 %, Matur-  
ity Date December 1, 1965.

Bond No. 8, Amount \$1,000.00,  
Interest per Annum 3 1/2 %, Matur-  
ity Date December 1, 1966.

Bond No. 9, Amount \$1,000.00,  
Interest per Annum 3 1/2 %, Matur-  
ity Date December 1, 1967.

Bond No. 10, Amount \$1,000.00,  
Interest per Annum 3 1/2 %, Matur-

Bond No. 11, Amount \$1,000.00,  
Interest per Annum 4 1/4 %, Matur-

Bond No. 15, Amount \$1,000.00,  
Interest per Annum 4 1/4 %, Matur-  
ity Date December 1, 1973.

Bond No. 16, Amount \$1,000.00,  
Interest per Annum 4 1/4 %, Matur-  
ity Date December 1, 1974.

Bonds Nos. 17 and 18, Amount  
\$2,000.00, Interest per Annum  
4 1/2 %, Maturity Date December 1  
1975.

Bonds Nos. 19 and 20, Amount  
\$2,000.00, Interest per Annum  
4 1/2 %, Maturity Date December 1  
1976.

Bonds Nos. 21 and 22, Amount  
\$2,000.00, Interest per Annum  
4 1/2 %, Maturity Date December 1  
1977.

Bonds Nos. 23 and 24, Amount  
\$2,000.00, Interest per Annum  
4 1/2 %, Maturity Date December 1  
1978.

Interest on said bonds shall be  
payable June 1, 1959, and semi-  
annually thereafter on the first  
days of December and June in  
each year. Both principal and in-  
terest shall be payable at the of-  
fice of the State Treasurer in the  
City of Topeka, Kansas. Said  
bonds shall be in the usual form  
and contain the usual recitals and  
shall be signed by the Mayor and  
attested by the City Clerk and  
shall have the corporate seal of  
the city affixed thereon and the  
interest coupons shall bear litho-  
graphed facsimile signatures of  
the Mayor and City Clerk.

SECTION 2. Said bonds shall  
be registered by the City Clerk in  
his office and by the State Auditor  
of the State of Kansas as required  
by law and shall be offered to the  
State School Fund Commission as  
an investment of school funds  
and if not purchased by that Com-  
mission shall be sold according to  
law and the proceeds used for the  
purpose above stated.

SECTION 3. The City of And-  
over, Kansas hereby promises the  
holders of said bonds that the said  
city will make prompt payment of  
the principal and interest thereon  
when due, and it is made the duty  
of the governing body of the city  
to levy annually at the time of  
making levies for other city taxes  
a tax sufficient to pay the install-  
ments of principal and the interest  
on the bonds herein authorized as  
they severally mature; and the  
full faith, credit and resources of  
said city are irrevocably pledged  
for the prompt payment of said  
principal and interest when due.

SECTION 4. This ordinance  
shall be in force and take effect  
from and after its passage, ap-  
proval and publication once in  
The Western Butler County  
Times, the official city paper.

ORDINANCE NO. 8-101

AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING PERSONS AND PROPERTY OWNERS TO MAKE CONNECTIONS WITH THE SEWER SYSTEM OF THE CITY OF ANDOVER, KANSAS

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF ANDOVER, KANSAS:

SECTION 1. All persons or property owners owning dwelling houses or buildings within the City of Andover, Kansas, shall, upon notice in writing to do so from the local Board of Health, make proper and permanent connections to the sewer system of the city and remove or fill all privies and cesspools and abandon any use of septic tank systems. Any person owning such real property who, after having ten (10) days notice from the local Board of Health, shall fail to connect to the said sewer and remove or fill up such privies, cesspools or septic tanks shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and the City thereafter may cause such premises and buildings to be connected with said sewer system, advertise for bids for the construction and making of such sewer connections, contract with the lowest responsible bidder and assess the costs and expenses thereof against the property and premises so connected, all as provided by G.S. 1949, 12-631.

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, approval and publication once in the Western Butler County Times, the official city paper.
