ORDINANCE NO. 117

AN ORDINANCE ENACTED FOR THE PURPOSE OF PERMITTING POLICE OFFICE, CITY MARSHAL OR DEPUTY CITY MARSHAL OF THE CITY OF ANDOVER, KANSAS TO ACT AND PERFORM DUTIES AS SECURITY OFFICER UNDER CHAPTER 363 OF SESSION LAWS OF KANSAS, 1969, AND PROVIDING FOR APPROVAL OF SUCH APPOINTMENT AND THE METHOD FOR OBTAINING THE SAME

WHEREAS, prior hereto the legislature of the State of Kansas has enacted what is commonly known as Chapter 363 of the Session Laws of Kansas, 1969, providing for the permissive appointment of school security officers in the employ of school districts; and,

WHEREAS, it appears to the Governing Body of the City of Andover, Kansas, that in certain instances certain law enforcement officers of the City of Andover may be appointed as such school security officers; and,

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of the City of Andover, Kansas deems that it should provide the conditions under which a law enforcement officer employed by said city may also serve as a school security officer;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF ANDOVER, KANSAS:

Section 1. That any person who fills a capacity as marshal, deputy marshal, or police officer of the City of Andover, Kansas, shall not accept appointment or employment as a school security officer without first obtaining the consent of the Mayor and approval of a majority of the councilmen elect at a regular meeting, or a special meeting held for that purpose.

The above ordinance passed and adopted this 13 day of December, 1969, by the Governing Body of the City of Andover, Kansas.
