ORDINANCE NO. 128

AN ORDINANCE PRESCRIBING SCHOOL ZONES UPON THE STREETS AND ROADWAYS OF THE CITY OF ANDOVER KANSAS AND PROVIDING A SPEED LIMIT FOR VEHICULAR TRAFFIC IN SCHOOL ZONES AND PROVIDING A FINE AND PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION OF THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF ANDOVER, KANSAS

Section 1. That the following portions of the streets and roadways in the City of Andover, Kansas, are hereby designated to be school zones, to-wit:

- (a) On Andover Road from the North Corporation Limits of said City, southward to a point two hundred feet South of its intersection with the South line of Allison Street.
- (b) Church Street from the North line of South Street, southward to the South line of the Kansas Turnpike overpass. ^{See (b)} *repealed by Ord # 134*

Section 2. That no person shall operate a motor vehicle within the school zones provided herein at a speed in excess of Fifteen miles per hour. *repealed by Ord # 134*

Section 3. Any person violating the provisions of this Ordinance shall upon conviction thereof, be fined in a sum not less than Five Dollars (\$5) and not more than Fifty Dollars (\$50), or be imprisoned for not more than Thirty (30) days, or be both so fined and imprisoned.

The above Ordinance duly passed and adopted by the Governing Body of the City of Andover, Kansas this 14 day of February, 1970.
