

ORDINANCE NO. 188

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING A PORTION OF ORDINANCE NO. 184 AS PASSED AND ADOPTED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF ANDOVER, KANSAS ON THE 10TH DAY OF FEBRUARY, 1973, AND REDEFINING THE TERM "ALCOHOLIC LIQUOR" AND DECLARING THE BALANCE AND REST OF THE SAID ORDINANCE TO BE IN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF ANDOVER, KANSAS:

Section 1. That the following Section of Ordinance No. 184, as adopted by the Governing Body of the City of Andover, Kansas, on the 10th day of February, 1973, and reading as follows:

Section 1. Definitions.

(a) For the purpose of this Ordinance, the term "alcoholic liquor" shall not only be as the same is defined in K.S.A. 1969 Supp. 41-102(2), that is, to include the four varieties of liquor, namely alcohol, spirits, wine and beer, and every liquid or solid, patented or not, containing alcohol, spirits, wine, or beer, and capable of being consumed as a beverage by a human being, but shall also include any beer or cereal malt beverage containing not less than three and two-tenths percent (3.2%) of alcohol by weight, as such cereal malt beverages are defined in K.S.A. 41-2701.

should be and hereby is amended^{to read}/as follows:

Section 1. Definitions.

(a) For the purpose of this Ordinance, the term "alcoholic liquor" shall not only be as the same is defined in K.S.A. 1969 Supp. 41-102(2), that is, to include the four varieties of liquor, namely alcohol, spirits, wine and beer, and every liquid or solid, patented or not, containing alcohol, spirits, wine, or beer, and capable of being consumed as a beverage by a human being, but shall also include any beer or cereal malt beverage containing less than three and two-tenths percent (3.2%) of alcohol by weight, as such cereal malt beverages are defined in K.S.A. 41-2701.

Section 2. That notwithstanding the amendment of said Ordinance No. 184 as set out in Section 1 hereinabove, all other remaining sections and portions of sections of said Ordinance as originally adopted and published shall continue

to remain in full force and effect.
